Definition of Regional	Means a coordinated effort of, at a minimum, Coordinated Care Organizations, Community Mental Health

Letter of Intent	LPHA, as resources allow, shall cooperate, coordinate and act jointly with CCOs, CMHP/LMHAs, any other			
	county or counties, and key system partners in a Regional Behavioral Health Collaborative (RBHC). CCO,			
	CMHP/LMHA, LPHA or designee shall convene the RBHC and be the point of contact for OHA. LPHA shall			
	participate in the selection of the convener and may be the convener. LPHAs, as resources allow, are required			
	to participate and engage key system partners with CCOs and LMHAs/CMHPs. Each service area must identify			
	the key system partners that need to be included to meet the needs of the population across the lifespan and			
	reach the desired outcomes. Any federally-recognized tribe within the identified service area must be invited.			
	Individuals with lived experience must be represented. Additional members may include, but are not limited			
	to, family/caregivers, education, criminal justice, public safety, child welfare, early intervention, hospitals and			
	health systems, development disabilities system, aging and people with disabilities, veterans, behavioral health			
	providers, primary care, and advocates. Partners should be inclusive of culturally, linguistically and socially

Community-based Priorities Action Plan	Convener must submit for OHA approval, a "Community-based Priorities Action Plan" that is a specific plan (plans, timeline, benchmarks, milestones, and deliverables) across collaborative partners demonstrating how and when RBHC will achieve improvement in the behavioral health system. OHA will provide a template for the Community-based Priorities Action Plan required by this Contract where RBHC will detail strategies that target the identified Community-based Priorities and achieve desired outcomes, timeline, and deliverable expectation. RBHC will identify measures to track the achievement of desired outcomes. If the LPHA is selected as the Convener, the LPHA is responsible for submitting the Community-based Priorities Action Plan to OHA for approval on the OHA-provided template.					
Reporting	1. Monitoring and Compliance Review LPHA, If selected to be the Convener, agrees to report progress toward achieving the objectives and timelines identified in its Community-based Priorities Action Plan and to cooperate with OHA in providing evidence of progress consistent with the Plan. 2. Community-based Priorities Action Plan Deliverables LPHA, if selected to be the Convener, shall provide the following deliverables on the schedule described below. Convener shall combine the reports for all Community-based Priorities into a single report.
