Contract Element	Draft language
Definition of Regional Behavioral Health Collaborative	Means a coordinated effort of, at a minimum, Coordinated Care Organizations, Community Mental Health Programs/Local Mental Health Authorities, Local Public Health Authorities, and the Tribes. Other key system partners must be engaged in each geographic region to focus on the behavioral health care needs of the entire population: children, young adults, adults and older adults.
Letter of Intent	<p>LPHA, as resources allow, shall cooperate, coordinate and act jointly with CCOs, CMHP/LMHAs, any other county or counties, and key system partners in a Regional Behavioral Health Collaborative (RBHC). CCO, CMHP/LMHA, LPHA or designee shall convene the RBHC and be the point of contact for OHA. LPHA shall participate in the selection of the convener and may be the convener. LPHAs, as resources allow, are required to participate and engage key system partners with CCOs and LMHAs/CMHPs. Each service area must identify the key system partners that need to be included to meet the needs of the population across the lifespan and reach the desired outcomes. Any federally-recognized tribe within the identified service area must be invited. Individuals with lived experience must be represented. Additional members may include, but are not limited to, family/caregivers, education, criminal justice, public safety, child welfare, early intervention, hospitals and health systems, development disabilities system, aging and people with disabilities, veterans, behavioral health providers, primary care, and advocates. Partners should be inclusive of culturally, linguistically and socially diverse populations.</p> <p>LPHA, as resources allow and in partnership with CCOs, CMHP/LMHA and other key system partners shall define the geographic region of the RBHC. OHA recommends that the geographic regions follow the CCO service areas. RBHCs can submit an exception to this recommendation which OHA will consider. In areas of overlapping CCOs and counties of authority, the goal is to establish one RBHC if possible.</p>
Community-based Priorities and Rationale	<p>If LPHA is selected as and agrees to be convener, LPHA shall lead the convening of key system partners to review relevant state and local needs assessments, reports, data, and other information needed to select three Community-based Priorities.</p> <p>If LPHA is not the convener, LPHA, as resources allow, shall cooperate, coordinate and act jointly with selected convener to review the Community Health-needs Assessment (CHA), Community Health Improvement Plan (CHP) and relevant state and local needs assessments, reports, data, and other information needed to select</p>

	<p>Progress reports must address each Community-based Priority, including actions taken or being taken to achieve the target outcome of these activities, and process improvements.</p>
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	<p>Progress reports must also identify any areas where the Contractor has encountered barriers to achieving the target outcome, and describe its efforts to develop alternative strategies.</p>
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
