### Summary of adopted local public health process measures

Local public health process measures bring attention to the unique and essential roles and functions of public health departments to achieve the public health accountability metrics.

	Public Health Accountability Metric	Local public health process measures adopted by PHAB
Communicable disease control	Two-year-old vaccination rates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Percent of Vaccines for Children clinics [that serve populations experiencing vaccination disparities] that participate in the Assessment, Feedback, Incentives and eXchange (AFIX) program</li> </ul>
	Gonorrhea rates	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Percent of gonorrhea cases that had at least one contact that received treatment</li> <li>- Percent of gonorrhea case reports with complete "priority" fields</li> </ul>
Prevention and Health Promotion	Adults who smoke cigarettes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Percent of community members reached by local [tobacco retail/smoke free] policies</li> </ul>
	Opioid overdose deaths	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Percent of top prescribers enrolled in the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP)</li> </ul>
Environmental Health	Active transportation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Number of active transportation partner governing or leadership boards with LPHA representation</li> </ul>
	Drinking water standards	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Number of water systems surveys completed</li> <li>- Number of water quality alert responses</li> <li>- Number of priority non-compliers (PNCs) resolved</li> </ul>
Access to Clinical Preventive Services	Effective contraceptive use	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Do not adopt a local public health process measure at this time. Continue to explore public health roles and functions for assuring access to effective contraceptives.</li> </ul>
	Dental visits among children ages 0-5 years	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Do not adopt a local public health process measure at this time. Continue to explore public health roles and functions to assure access to dental visits for 0-5 year olds.</li> </ul>
