^{*}House Bill 5026 (2017 session) specified that \$16 million of marijuana tax revenues be spent on community mental health services. Current statute directs marijuana tax revenues into the Mental Health Alcoholism and Drug Services Account, which can only allocate moneys for drug abuse prevention, early intervention and treatment services, and not community mental health services. Senate Bill 1555 A does not change the distributions or the revenue amounts, but enables the OHA to distribute a portion of the retail marijuana tax revenues to community mental health services.
