DEQ Air Quality Stakeholder Recruitment to participate

Matt Davis asked for volunteers to routinely (90 minute meetings 4-6 times per year) get a public health lens and help set DEQ agenda. Several LPHAs were interested in participating remotely.

Early Learning Strategic Plan

There is an early learning strategic plan online. System goals are the same as they had been. Reproductive health services were put into the new strategic plan. More information about implementation will come in the next week. There is also a bill to change the membership of the early learning council.

County Health Rankings Follow-up Volunteer Recruitment

CLHO was awarded county health rankings funds to help move the equity assessments LPHAs are doing into action by getting community input into the equity assessments. LPHAs can apply for \$1100 grants to help with community engagement. Caitlin will send out applications shortly.

Douglas County Update

Douglas County has contracted out a lot of public health services and there are conversations happening about the possibility of moving the local public health authority to the Oregon Health Authority. Discussion that this impacts the whole public health system. Discussion that the lack of a Health and Human Services Manager at the Association of Oregon Counties has been difficult for counties. There are philosophical conversations about who pays for public health.

OSBN - Standing Orders

State Board of Nursing had a stakeholder meeting in December. Local Health Officials and CLHO Staff who attended observed that it was challenging to participate or provide input at the meeting. Gathered that the practice of standing orders in communities doesn't fit under current law. Morgan working on getting a letter of support from health officers about the types of standing orders that are protecting communities.



2019 Legislative Session Preview

Bills were introduced on Monday. Currently reading bills. Committees start on Tuesday. A lot of the time will be spent on those bills.

CLHO Meeting Schedule

CLHO will have two in-person meetings during session – one in Salem and one in Portland. More to come.

CLHO Legislative Committee recommendations
