CDC Cooperative Agreement for Emergency Response: COVID-19 Public Health Crisis Response

Background

The CDC has allocated funding to state, local, territorial and tribal health departments to carry out surveillance, epidemiology, laboratory capacity, infection control, mitigation, communications and other preparedness response activities. A total of \$7.8M has been awarded to Oregon, of which \$500,000 was previously allocated to purchase testing supplies at the Oregon State Public Health Laboratory. This leaves an additional \$7.3M with \$389,941 going to Tribes and NARA.

Funding includes the following domains:

- Domain 1: Incident Management for Early Crisis Response (already supported by initial \$500,000 and the \$5,000,000 Oregon General Fund investment)
- Domain 2: Jurisdictional Recovery
- Domain 3: Information Management
- Domain 4: Countermeasures and Mitigation
- Domain 5: Surge Management
- Domain 6: Biosurveillance

Required activities:

1. Surveillance, Laboratory Testing and Reporting
2. Community Intervention Implementation Plan (see draft PE 12 language for specifics)

Funding information

- PE 12, Public Health Emergency Preparedness, will be the vehicle for receiving these funds under sub-element -02.
- LPHAs will be paid their full award up front upon execution of the contract amendment.
- LPHAs will need to complete a budget plan and narrative within 30 days of receiving their award.
