- \$20 million of total awards
- EPA expects to fund 50-70 grant proposal

EPA's objective is to enable communities to monitor their own air quality and to promote monitoring partnerships that:


- Leverage existing air quality monitoring expertise;

- Build a foundation of trusting relationships to develop sustainable solutions to community air pollution problems.

DEQ is planning to submit two grant proposals that:


- leverage DEQ's air quality monitoring expertise;

- within the framework of trusting relationships between communities, advocacy groups, local and state agencies to develop sustainable solutions to community air pollution problems.




PM2.5: ~2000 premature deaths (Bowe et al, 2019)





Air toxics: cumulative cancer risk ~23/million (NATA 2014)
