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# House Bill 4098 (2022)

Estimated total of >\$333 million coming to Oregon

- **55% to Subdivision Fund**
  - Approx. \$183 million paid by DOJ directly to cities and counties (pop. >10,000)
  - OHA not involved in subdivision fund
  - Allocation decisions are made locally
- **45% to State of Oregon Opioid Settlement Prevention, Treatment & Recovery Fund**
  - Approx. \$150 million in 18 payments through 2038
  - OHA staffing the state portion of the settlement
  - Allocation decisions made by advisory board

# **Tribal Opioid Settlements**

Approximately \$503 million is going directly to Tribes and Alaskan tribal health organizations from Janssen & Distributor Settlements.

All federally recognized Tribes are eligible to participate in the Tribal Opioid Settlements, regardless of whether a Tribe filed an opioid lawsuit.

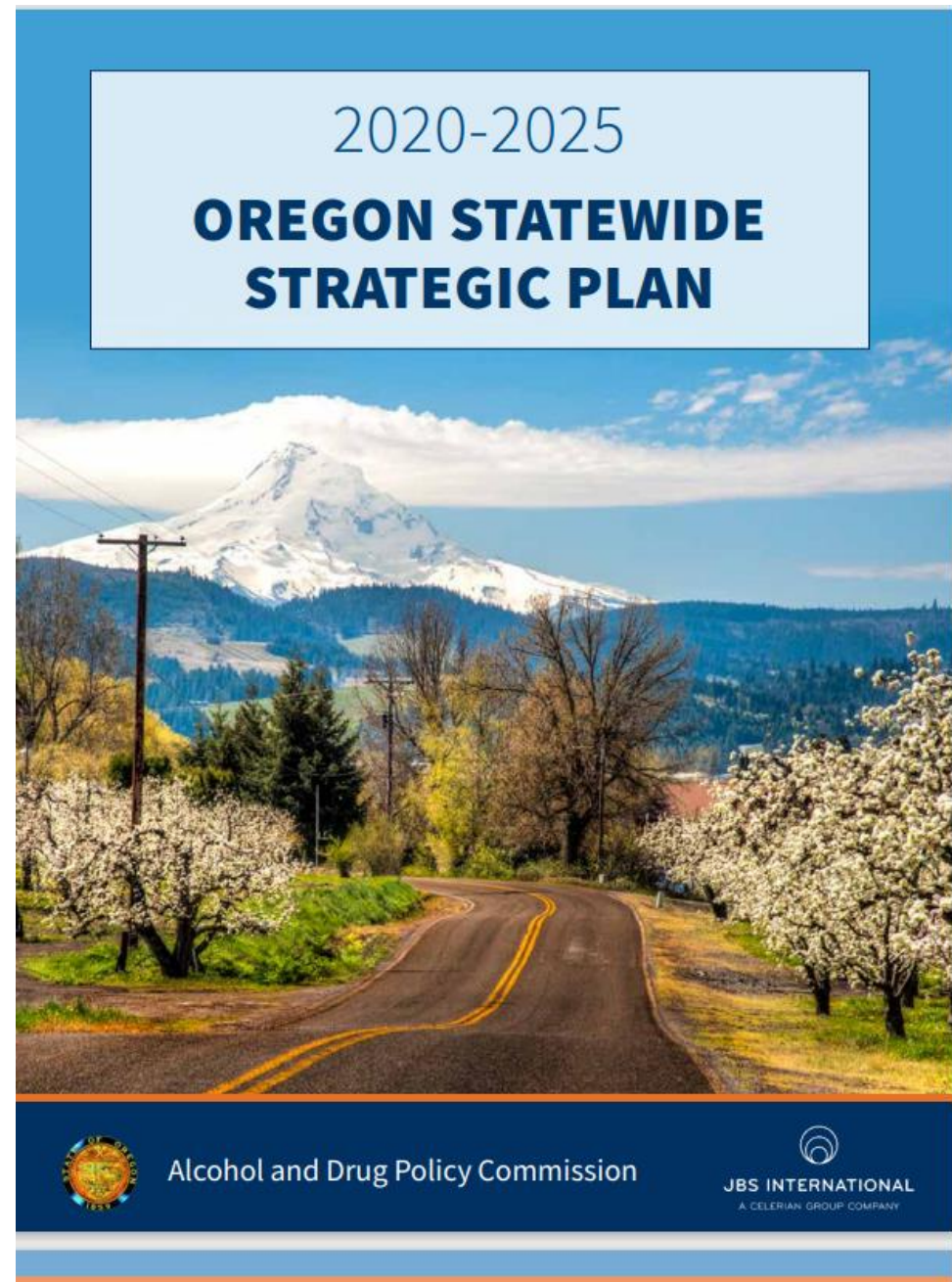

Warm handoff recovery programs & services

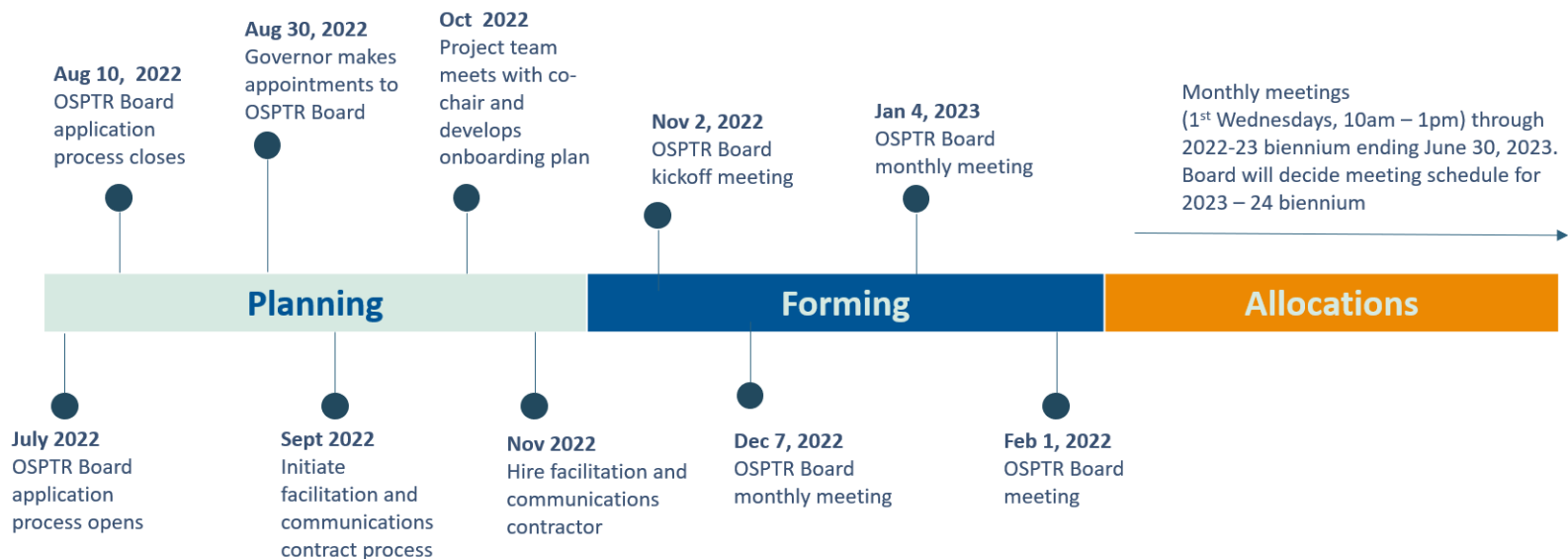
Leadership, planning & coordination
