Basics of Oregon School Immunization Requirements

- Help protect almost 650,000 children against 11 vaccinepreventable diseases.
- Help build community immunity.
- Make sure kids can be brought up-to-date on vaccines at least once a year.














Oregon Kindergarten Nonmedical Exemption Rates




Percentage of Kindergartners with Any Exemption, by School Year







Kindergarten Immunization Data

Statewide, over 87% of kindergarten students completed all school-required vaccines in 2023. From 90% to 94% of kindergartners completed each individual required vaccine. Use the year and county selection tools to change the displays of vaccination rates. *Note: county-specific immunization rates are missing for 1992 and 1996.*



The map shows the percent of kindergartners with complete school-required vaccines by county. The darker the color, the higher the vaccination rate.





- 3. To find a school or child care, you can type the name or address in the search box, or zoom in on the map.
- 4. Once you select a location, a pop up window will show you the immunization rates for that site.



2-year-old Immunization Rates

Childhood series: Trends over time

Among the vaccines included in the recommended early childhood series, PCV has the lowest up-to-date rate among 2yo children, driving down the series completion rate. This may be a result of the 4 doses required to complete the series, similar to DTaP, but it is not required for school entry. As different children may be behind on different vaccines, the series up-to-date rate is lower than the individual vaccine rates.
