



What are the two CLHOs





Coalition of Local Health Officials

- 501(c)(6) non-profit organization (funded by member dues)
- Represents all of Oregon's 33 LPHAs
- Advocates to the Oregon Legislature and tracks policy that impacts LPHAs
- Provides workforce and communications support
- 2 Staff (Executive Director and Program Manager)
 - 4 more staff for special projects
- Member-led organization
 - Legislative Committee recommends policy priorities
 - Workforce Development Committee recommends workforce priorities and initiatives
 - Executive Committee and Board of Directors approve and direct CLHO staff's workforce and communications priorities



Conference of Local Health Officials



Exists in Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS 431.330)



Forum for Oregon Health Authority and Local Public Health Authorities (LPHAs) to discuss expectations, funding, program elements, and other governmental public health issues.



"Big CLHO" Board is made up of all the local health administrators



Made up of 6 Committees and 3 Caucuses that make recommendations to the Board



Committee members are appointed by health administrator (approved at Big CLHO)

Conference Committees

Access to Clinical and Preventive Services (A2CPS)

 Maternal and Child Health, WIC, School-based Health, Home-visiting, Reproductive Health, etc.

Communicable Disease (CD)

Tuberculosis, HIV, STIs, Immunizations, COVID, etc.

Environmental Health (EH)

Drinking Water, Climate and Health, Brownfields, Lead, etc.

Emergency Preparedness and Response (EPR)

Health Promotion and Prevention (HPP)

 Tobacco Retail Licensing, Substance Use Prevention, Overdose Prevention, Injury and Violence Prevention, etc.

Systems and Innovation (S&I)

Public Health Modernization, alignment, accreditation, etc.



How the Conference Committees Function

Restructured in 2018 to align with Public Health Modernization

According to Conference Bylaws + Committee Charter

CLHO Board Member appoints staff to committees (confirmed by CLHO Chair)

Each LPHA can have up to two representatives per committee (but 1 vote per committee)

Terms are indefinite

Most Committees meet monthly

How the Conference Committees Function

Committees select two co-chairs from among their members (process different across committees)

Each Committee supported by OHA Lead and Administrative Support

Co-Chairs + OHA Lead develop meeting agendas

Co-Chairs communicate with the committee members, help set agendas, facilitate meetings, and present recommendations to Big CLHO

When a Committee votes, they are making a recommendation to the CLHO Board/Big CLHO → Committee Co-Chairs and OHA staff present at next CLHO Board Meeting

Annual Meeting in October → Co-chairs present committee reports the Big CLHO

For logistics and process not defined, CLHO and OHA are developing an MOU.






