- Focused on advocacy, legislative efforts, and partnerships
- Highlights: hired communications staff, organized WIC event
- Conducted 64 legislator meetings, maintained four priority bills
- Increased social media presence
- Produced workforce videos and a comprehensive workforce report

Rural Communications (Kate Szrom)

- Kate Drum serves five Eastern Oregon counties
- Created emergency response communications
- Developed regional flu vaccine ad
- Focused on providing clear, accessible public health information

Program Manager Year in Review & Workforce Report Overview (Allison Mora)

- Onboarded as program manager 11 months ago
- Communications:
 - Curated 35 weekly briefs
 - Created 40 Instagram and 43 Facebook posts
 - o Increased social media followers (14.7% Instagram, 10% Facebook)
 - Launched the CLHO ambassadors program as part of the legislative advocacy efforts
- Designed and facilitated four workforce development webinars
- Led the development of the 2025 CLO local public health workforce report

CLHO FY2025-26 Budget | Discussion, VOTE | Speaker

Overview: Sarah gave a thorough overview of the FY2025-26 Budget.

- Sara presented the proposed budget for FY 2025-2026, including income from dues, OHA support, rural communications, and other sources.
- The total income for the upcoming fiscal year is projected to be \$527,616, with expenses projected at \$437,246, resulting in a surplus of \$90,000.



- The budget includes funding for Jenny Rudolph's position, lobbying contractor, communications, trainers, web development, and other expenses.
- Sara emphasizes the importance of staying the course with the budget and being prepared to make adjustments in response to funding uncertainty.

VOTE: Jocelyn (Lane) motioned to approve. Florence (Lincoln) seconded. All remaining in favor. CLHO FY2025-26 budget approved.

Legislative Updates | Updates | Sarah Lochner, CLHO ED

Overview: Sarah Lochner gave an overview of the latest legislative updates impacting CLHO.

Legislative Session Status:

- 38 organizational endorsements gathered
- 64 legislator meetings held
- Five-member lobbying days conducted
- Seven testimony panels organized
- Four priority bills are still alive

Key Bill Highlights:

- 1. Addiction Primary Prevention Bill:
 - o Passed out of committee unanimously, has bipartisan support and is headed to Ways and Means
- 2. Workforce Bill (House Bill 3916):
 - o Aims to provide scholarships for: Community paramedics, community health workers and local public health staff
 - Currently in Ways and Means, awaiting funding
- 3. CCO Salon Bills (House Bill 2216 and 2222):
 - o Related to the Healthy Rural Oregon grant and is still active in the legislative process



Other Legislative Developments:

- Ongoing discussions about the revenue forecast
- Potential impact of federal funding cuts
- Continued advocacy for public health funding
- Preparing end-of-session report
- Working to maintain relationships with legislators and state agencies

General Discussion & Member Announcements | Updates | CLHO Board Members

Concerns About Federal Funding and DEI Policies:

- Discussion about the potential impacts of federal policies on state funding
 - o Concerns raised about local-level decision-making to avoid losing money
- Sarah Lochner acknowledged ongoing governmental challenges with DEI policies
- Recognized the complexity of maintaining DEI initiatives while preserving funding

Announcements:

- Kari's term on the opioid settlement board is ending and she is willing to continue unless someone else is nominated
- The OSTPR Board meets on the first Wednesday of each month
- House Bill 2929 will create an administrator seat on the Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission, and there is a call for nominations for the LPHA administrator seat. Sarah (CLHO) emphasised the importance of regular attendance, vocal advocacy and continued legislative engagement for the administrator that will fill this role.

- Keep tracking legislative updates
- Conduct outreach to legislative representatives
- Prepare for potential future policy changes
