Agenda Item Topics

Federal Updates | Updates | Naomi Adeline-Biggs, OHA-PHD

Overview: Naomi gave a brief overview of the latest federal updates.

- Naomi discussed ongoing uncertainty about federal public health funding, with pending litigation on terminated grants and OHA awaiting the 2026 federal budget negotiations.
- OHA is also actively monitoring potential impacts and collecting ground-level information from local public health authorities.

Discussion/Q&A:

- Shane (Linn) raised concerns about \$620.5 billion in Medicaid cuts
- Discussion around the need for detailed information on potential program impacts
- Naomi (OHA) emphasized collecting ground-level information from local public health authorities to support advocacy efforts

Public Health Equity Grant- LPHA Involvement | Discussion | Josillia Johnson, OHA-PHD, Jessica Beltran, OHA-PHD

Overview: Josillia and Jessica provide updates on the Public Health Equity grant process, including updates to the RFGA project plan, eligibility criteria, and application review process.

- Jessica highlighted the importance of LPHA participation in the RFGA process and the need for specific language in the application to ensure alignment with community health improvement plans.
- Jocelyn discussed the application projections for cohort three, estimating around 400 applications, and outlined the timeline for the application review process, including orientation and training sessions in September.

Discussion/Q&A:

- Martha (NCPHD) expressed interest in participating but acknowledged capacity constraints
- Heather (Deschutes) asked about support for new CBOs wanting to apply
- Rebecca (Malheur) inquired about requiring CBOs to connect with LPHAs
- Some counties expressed interest in being involved in the review process: Jennifer (Klamath), Heather (Dechutes), Florence (Lincoln), Marie (Washington), Katie (Jefferson), Shane (Linn), Kari (Polk), Rebecca (Malheur), Sara (Benton), Jocelyn (Lane), Trish (Hood River) and Martha (NCPHD)

PE 44: SBHC Changes | Updates, VOTE | Stefanie Murray, OHA-PHD

Overview: Stefanie introduced the changes to program element 44, which includes the school-linked telehealth pilot program and the school-linked mobile unit pilot program.

- Stefanie provided an overview of the current grantees and funding allocations for the telehealth and mobile unit programs.
- The proposed changes include operating criteria and a funding formula for the telehealth grant, and the addition of the school-linked mobile grant to allow LPHAs to apply for funding.

Discussion/Q&A:

- Katie (Crook) questioned the effectiveness of mobile and telehealth services
 - Stefanie shared success stories from specific communities like Gresham
- Stefanie also discussed the challenges of service delivery without on-site staffing
 - Anticipating around \$400,000 available for grants

Health Equity Framework Updates | Discussion | Vanessa Cardona, OHA-PHD, William Blackford, OHA-PHD

Overview: Vanessa and William provided updates on the health equity framework.

- Framework Highlights:
 - 1.5-year collaborative project
 - o 15-member work group including CBOs, tribal members, and local health authorities
 - o Developed 99 complementary roles for public health collaboration
- Key Objectives:
 - Create companion document to Public Health Modernization Manual
 - Define roles for CBOs and tribes in health equity and community partnerships
 - Document collaboration strategies learned during COVID-19
- Main Ask- Gather LPHA Feedback On:
 - Document usefulness
 - Potential improvements
 - Structural readability

Discussion/Q&A:

- Marie (Washington) suggested potential connection to CBO grant applications
- Sara (OHA) noted alignment between framework and grant requirements

Public Health Accountability Metrics | Discussion | Sara Beaudrault, OHA-PHD

Overview: Sara discussed the upcoming accountability metrics report, focusing on public health goals to reduce syphilis, increase vaccination rates, and protect against extreme heat and air quality events.

- The report includes a flowchart and tables detailing local public health authorities' (LPHAs) progress on immunization rates, particularly for two-year-old vaccinations and adult influenza vaccinations.
- Sara also emphasized the need for resources and proposed three work groups to refine process measures and address gaps, aiming for diverse state representation.
- Interested parties were encouraged to volunteer for these groups to improve metrics and strategies by 2030.

OSPTR Board Updates: Carrie Brogoitti

- Carrie provided a brief overview of what was discussed in the most recent OSTPR Board meeting, including the allocation of research funding to two projects.
 - The projects focus on improving post-release engagement and enhancing SU D outcomes, and creating and evaluating an Addiction Medicine Champion Program at OHSU.
- Carrie also discussed the ongoing work in subcommittees and the upcoming allocation of funds for the next biennium.
