

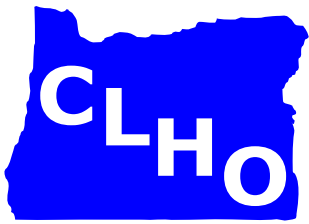

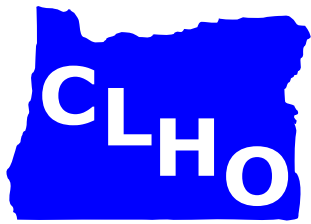

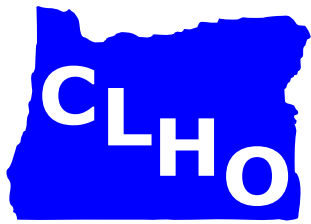

Discussion Item		The group decided that there would not be a July meeting because of the July 4 <sup>th</sup> holiday meeting date. Meetings will resume in August.	Committee
EMS Daya Query Information	Discussion	<p>Robyn Ellis is the OHA Data to Action Coordinator. She presented an overview of ESSENCE queries on overdose visits to emergency departments, urgent care, and EMS response calls. Since her first published opioid overdose query in 2020 the landscape has changed with fentanyl overdoses replacing heroin and other drugs and she is updating her Oregon Opioid Overdose query v.1 for ED data accordingly.</p> <p>During her EMS opioid query development the following calls became apparent:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Calls for people experiencing issues with their medications that may not be overdoses</li><li>• Law enforcement encounters with individuals who may or may not have swallowed illicit fentanyl</li><li>• Naloxone administration from bystanders not recorded in the medications given field</li></ul>	Robyn Ellis



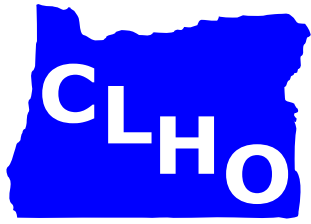
		<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Calls that are vague or contain contradictory information and are difficult to categorize as opioid overdose</li></ul> <p>Robyn emphasized that there is diversity in EMS data and she expressed an appreciation of EMS providers and the work they provide.</p> <p>Sara Herd asked if the queries would provide information, including trends with cultural and racial demographics. Robyn said age, sex, and location would be available but racial demographics in EMS data are not reliable at this time. LPHA's should be able to use geographical locations in their analyses of EMS overdose calls with greater specificity than ED visits.</p> <p>Robyn confirmed that ESSENCE users would have access to queries that she publishes for ED and EMS data, but that current ESSENCE users will need to request access to EMS data within ESSENCE.</p> <p>Hannah asked if a query using the key words Narcan or Naloxone for overdoses would cover the data. Robyn confirmed that her EMS opioid query included those terms in the narrative as well as medications field in combinations with other key terms. She also specified that it is not always clear who administered Narcan or Naloxone in EMS data.</p> <p>Information to request access to EMS data for current ESSENCE users and meeting PowerPoint will be included with the minutes. 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Opioid Settlement & Ambassador Update		<p>Jen and Courtney gave an update on the Opioid Settlement allocations for primary prevention and the Ambassador Team. The \$13.7 million primary prevention allocations include \$9.5 million for counties, \$3.8 million for culturally and linguistically responsive community-based organizations and regional health equity coalitions, and \$450,000 to support certified prevention specialists.</p> <p>The Ambassador Team is comprised of representatives from partner groups listed in the Board-approved ADPC proposal. The Ambassador Team will work a contractor to determine funding formulas for counties. Ambassadors must attend all four meetings. There is a \$500 stipend to attend the meetings for eligible participants. Ambassador Team representatives will present their proposed funding formula and implementation plan to the CLHO HPP committee in August. With committee approval, the proposal will move to Big CLHO. The goal is to present the final proposal to the Opioid Settlement Board at the September 4<sup>th</sup> meeting.</p> <p>Jennifer asked if the Ambassador group would only include CLHO HPP members. Courtney said they would like one local Public Health Administrator in addition to the CLHO HPP committee members. CLHO Ambassadors are responsible for engaging their partner network, including their LPH Administrator, to inform their participation on the full Ambassador Team. 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TPEP Governance Update		<p>Gwyn and Amanda presented an update on the TPEP governance model. The TPEP Ambassador group and OHA requested a CLHO letter of support for the OHA TPEP Executive Order Proposal.</p> <p>OHA's request and proposal to the Governor is to rescind the Executive Order no. EO-97-10 creating the <a href="#">Tobacco Reduction Advisory Committee</a> (TRAC) and create a new Executive Order that will provide stability for commercial tobacco program funding. This will hold OHA accountable to our commitment to end health inequities by engaging communities who are most impacted.</p> <p>With the CLHO HPP approval, the proposal would move to Big CLHO.</p> <p>The committee had a general agreement of approval of the letter which will move to the Big CLHO meeting.</p>

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		<p>(NRT) to local community members. TPEP dollars would be used to purchase the NRT. She was asking if committee members could share their experiences with the process. Jamie suggested people often receive NRT through their medical providers. Hannah said that Malheur looked into dispensing and it was suggested that before giving NRT to a patient, they would need to discuss their health with a nurse.</p> <p>Jamie Zenter confirmed the “Nicotine Treatment Systems Affinity Group” meets the 2<sup>nd</sup> Thursday/month at 9:00AM for the committee.</p>
