



Co-Chair Update		Elisabeth and Hannah announced that the committee will be looking for a new co-chair to replace Hannah. Hannah will be staying with Malheur County but in a different position. Committee members thanked Hannah for her service as co-chair. Please reach out to Elisabeth or Jackie if anyone is interested in serving as co-chair. We will discuss this at the next meeting.	
ADPEP PE 36 Revision		<p>Courtney and Jen presented an update on the PE 36 revision, which includes the additional opioid settlement funding for ADPEP grantees. Courtney said the state opioid settlement board approved OHA's proposed funding formula and implementation plan. A special thank you went out to Jessica Jacks, Stephanie O'Neil, Armando Jimenez and Jennifer Little for their work on the Ambassador Team's funding proposal. The proposal of \$9.5 million for primary prevention implementation and administration was approved for counties.</p> <p>Proposed changes to PE 36-01 include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">Grantees will implement local plans to adhere to national opioid settlement primary prevention strategies	Courtney Fultineer & Jen Chandler



		<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Grantee budgets and workplans will be to OHA by 11/15 for review and approval process• Any budget shifts greater than 10% will require OHA approval• Reporting requirements for the sub-grant progress report will be two times a year with the first period being 10/24 to 6/25. Funding has a 10/1 start date• Gwen asked if there would be two separate work plans needed with the sub element. Jen confirmed that going forward into the next biennium that one plan is required with a distinction noted for the opioid settlement funding stream. The settlement board expect these funds to be accounted for separately.• Jessica wanted to assure that the ambassador's recommendation to carryover funds across biennia was confirmed and if any counties had denied the funds. The board approved fund carryover but emphasized grantee spending should be timely and strategic to make an impact. All eligible Oregon counties accepted the funds.• Jennifer asked about the evaluation component for the funding. The PE has evaluation requirements; however, the board will be discussing this further at the October meeting. More to come at future meetings.• Jamie wanted to know if the SAMHSA required primary activities will include more upstream program goals. Danna Drum pointed out that the language stated, "included but not limited to" and would cover different activities.• Lindsey Manfrin asked about healthy food being connected to opioid use disorder.	
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2024 HB 4002 Discussion		<p>Isabelle Cisco presented on drug recriminalization, diversion & deflection with changes to Measure 110 and the adoption of HB 4002. Isabelle is the Oregon Public Health Analyst with the Overdose Response Strategy (ORS). Locally, Isabelle works between OHA and the OR-ID High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area (HIDTA). She presented an overview of Measure 110 and its implementation and covered the subsequent changes to the legislation under HB 4002.</p> <p>Diversion and deflection under HB 4002 allowed counties to opt in and was not mandated by the state. Changes are happening rapidly with the legislation in the counties supported by the \$21 million dollar grant through the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission.</p>	Isabelle Cisco



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		<p>Diversion is defined as post-arrest and post booking, with involvement with the criminal justice system like drug courts. This involves minimal justice system activity. Deflection is pre-arrest booking to minimize the criminal justice system involvement and focus on community service integration.</p> <p>Isabelle shared a pathway and systems model of care in diversion. Challenges for public safety and community services are also included in her PowerPoint. Toolkit contacts and behavioral health provisions describe overdose response strategies.
