	The plan was adjusted to incorporate feedback as much as possible by increasing resource allocations for direct community grants, reducing allocation for new health communications state infrastructure (Rethink the Drink brand) and slightly increasing resources for Technical Assistance and Training (includes workforce development and data and evaluation). OHA recognized the sustainability of one-time funds, SABG level funding at the community (and state) for many years, and minimal investment in state infrastructure (~9%). The revised approach maintains priorities in community program relief and building limited state infrastructure (contracts in data/surveillance, TA, health communications) to work together to advance local and state programs and initiatives.	
	CLHO HPP member and guest comments appreciated the opportunity to provide feedback, seeing working drafts along the way and how changes were made, while recognizing there is still work to do. There is recognition that work has been historically underfunded (together state and local) and not as robust as it could be. Even though they are one time, the program could come out the other side with stronger infrastructure. OHA would like to move forward in determining feasible mechanisms to steward direct grants and
