

CLHO Health Promotion & Prevention Committee Meeting Minutes

Thursday, February 6, 2025 1:00 – 2:00 PM Zoom Meeting

Meeting Notes Summary:

- Federal Changes and Funding Updates:
 - Encouragement to Share Concerns:
 - Participants were encouraged to share concerns about federal changes.
 - A team is monitoring these federal changes closely.
 - Funding is still active and available to continue county and state work.
 - Administrators are encouraged to attend Friday update meetings around federal changes.
 - Access to federal databases is a concern
- Immigration Changes and Impact on Marginalized Communities:
 - Pause on Community Focus Groups:
 - Immigration policy changes are affecting how counties address concerns within marginalized communities.
 - Focus groups are currently not being held in some counties.
 - Hispanic Health Committee Updates:
 - Fear expressed by community members about attending appointments for services like Woman's, Infants, and Children (WIC) benefits.
 - Efforts underway to issue benefits directly without requiring appointments, while adhering to necessary guidelines.
 - Legal guidance on what is permissible in public buildings has been provided.
 - Civil Rights/Sanctuary-Promise
 - Civil-Rights/Promesa-de-santuario/ (Spanish version of website)
 - <u>Sanctuary-promise/community-toolkit</u> -at the bottom of this site is a form where requests can be made for training



Community Outreach and Support:

- Some counties are meeting with communities to explain rights, reinforce supportive practices, and offer resources.
- Flyers with messages such as "Be Safe and Be Strong" have been distributed.

Funding Questions:

Non-Profit and Equity Coalitions Funding:

- Questions raised about the future of funding for non-profits and equity coalitions working with counties.
- Concerns about potential disruption of funding and the resulting impact on programs.

Funding Stream Status:

Measure 108 & Tobacco:

 These are housed in the state "Other" category of funding, continuing as usual.

General Fund:

Operating as usual.

Opioid Settlement Funds:

Counted as general fund and currently unaffected by federal changes.

• Immigration Policy and Sensitive Locations:

o 2011 Policy Rescinded:

 A policy that limited immigration enforcement in sensitive locations like healthcare facilities, churches, and schools has been rescinded.

Rapid Response Protocols:

- Some counties are developing protocols in response to potential law enforcement presence in facilities.
- Key points:
 - Staff are being trained on how to respond.
 - Patients are informed about their rights and how to respond.



- Private areas are being designated as such to ensure privacy.
- HIPAA and records request guidelines are being followed.
- Awareness and education campaigns are ongoing to support immigrant populations.

• Legislative Updates and Advocacy:

o Flavor Ban Bill:

- The statewide flavor ban bill is still active.
- Commissioners are hesitant to support policy change campaigns without visible traction.
- Encouragement for counties to share updates when visible traction is seen, allowing the information to be passed onto commissioners.

Public Health and Equity Advocacy:

Alcohol and Drug Commission:

- Discussion on advocating for a public health seat on the commission.
- Debate over the qualifications required for the board members—should they have CPS certifications or public health degrees?
- Working on amendments to the definition of primary prevention funds, which public health partners are dissatisfied with and looking to make some amendments.

Legislative Cessation Updates:

 Health Promotion and Chronic Disease Prevention section of Oregon Health Authority is acting as the hub for updates regarding legislative actions.

Vape Detector Bill:

- Inquiry raised about possible opposition from Oregon Health Authority on the vape detector bill for schools.
- OHA generally remains neutral, except on bills identified by the governor. A draft bill analysis is conducted, and problematic bills are flagged for discussion with legislators.



This bill was among the bills that were flagged.

Governor's Budget and Public Health:

Budget Allocation for Public Health:

- The proposed budget for public health is flat, with no major increase or decrease compared to the last biennium.
- A smaller modernization package is included.
- Previous biennium funds will continue to be used until gone.
- Disappointment expressed due to the 3% allocation, with concerns about its impact on counties and staff.
- CLHO is working to connect with tobacco and alcohol tax funds for additional support.

• Nicotine Replacement Program:

Launch of Program:

- A nicotine replacement program has been launched but has had zero participants thus far.
- Despite no participants, many clinics and physicians have inquired about the program.
