Review of minutes SAPT Funding	Funding proposal	The goal of the agenda item was to gather input on proposed SAPT block grant supplemental draft investments for local and state infrastructure and begin allocation process as soon as possible to distribute resources counties. The SAPT one-time supplemental engagement process has been a team endeavor (and pilot process with OHA and Prevention Ambassador colleagues). There has been a collaborative response to informing SAPT one-time supplemental prevention funding investments. Debby Jones said the group had gone above and beyond to get feedback for the funding approach. Tatiana, Megan and Amanda reviewed PPT. slides to share engagement to date, Triz Activity responses and draft SAPT one-time supplementation prevention investments. Jessica said the counties need to provide continued feedback. There was a concern that statewide mass reach health communications be tailored to county specific needs.
