

Planning for public health modernization funding to LPHAs

CLHO Systems and Innovation

March 18, 2019

Purpose: Provide update to CLHO Systems and Innovation committee on allocation of funding to LPHAs in 2019-21 if funding remains at \$5 million (\$3.9 million to LPHAs).

PHAB Incentives and Funding subcommittee recommendation for distributing \$3.9 million to LPHAs for 2019-21. (Recommendation likely to be formally adopted on 3/21/19)

1. Use funding to continue LPHA partnerships that are currently funded.
2. Avoid an RFP process, and take steps to minimize funding disruptions.
3. Allow LPHAs that were not involved in 2017-19 to join an existing group.
4. Use funding to advance local/regional systems for Communicable Disease Control and Health Equity and Cultural responsiveness.
 - While the general framework and requirements would remain the same, partnerships would be able to change the project goals, strategies, diseases of focus, and work plans. This would allow for natural progressions and course corrections.
 - Demonstrates that ongoing public health funding is needed to ensure a strong infrastructure is in place, not funding for “one and done” projects.

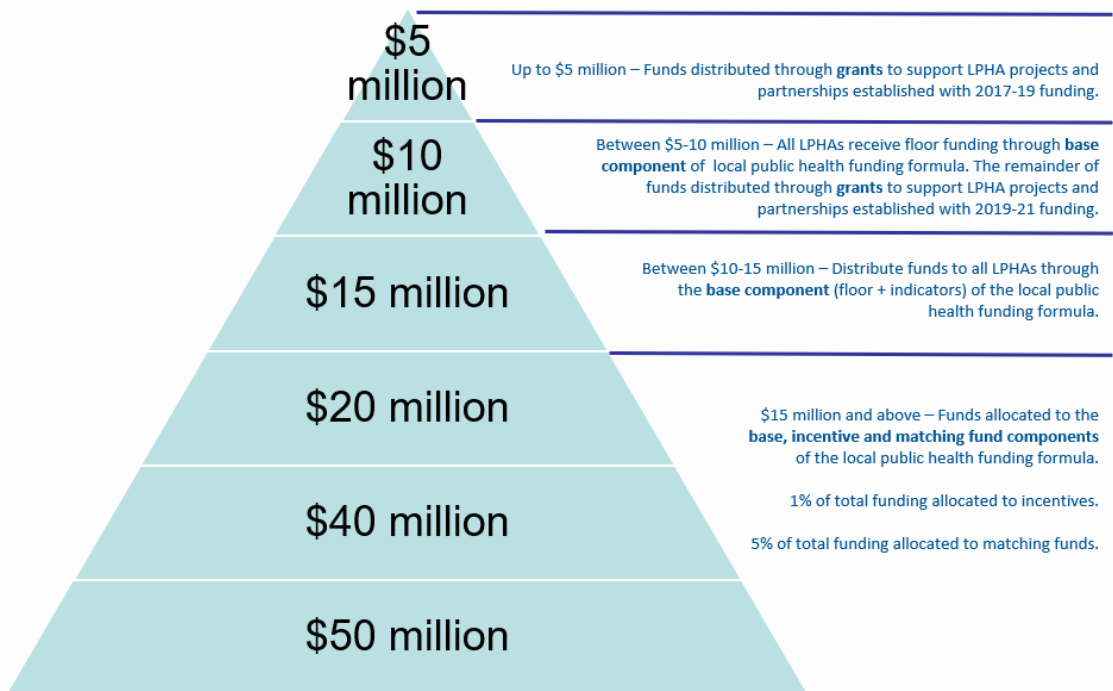
OHA is beginning to plan for allocating funds to LPHA partnerships as of July 1, 2019.

April-June	Discussions with CLHO about overarching goals for funding Updates to Program Element and maximum funding levels LPHA partnerships submit three-month budget and work plan
July-September	Allocate “bridge funding” for 7/1/19-9/30/19 based on current allocations
October	Revised Program Element in effect

Potential roles for CLHO Systems and Innovation (April/May)

1. Discuss overarching goals for funding
2. Review program element changes and 2019-21 maximum funding levels
3. Review requirements for bridge work plans and budgets
